Hawaiian Cultural Center's family program, Lei Aloha O Ka `Ohana, presents the First Annual `Ohana (family) Saturday

Midvale's Hawaiian Cultural Center strengthens family relationships with an afternoon of free games, storytelling, and a free movie.

Midvale – The Hawaiian Cultural Center in Midvale, Utah promotes family unity and relationship building through their family program, Lei Aloha O Ka `Ohana. April kicks off the second session of the program along with the family-oriented event `Ohana Saturday.

The Lei Aloha O Ka `Ohana program, which is funded by the Administration for Native Americans (ANA) offers free culturally based lessons and activities promoting family cohesiveness, teaching problem solving skills and strengthening relationships. The 3 month long program is designed to teach Native Hawaiian values and practices that are consistent with your own. Each Session includes 12 Monday night workshops, 2 weekend family activities and an informal end of program graduation, it is offered 4 times a year to better accommodate busy schedules. The second session starts April 5, 2010 at 6:30pm, and is currently accepting registration.

`Ohana Saturday, one of the family-oriented sponsored events, will be held on April 17, 3:00 - 8:00 pm. It will feature a free movie showing at 7pm. Before the movie starts there will be free carnival games, live entertainment from local artist's, and food vendors selling various flavors of Hawaii. `Ohana Saturday will also feature local storytellers bringing to life the folklore, culture, and history of both Utah and Hawaii.
